

The Union Station model railroad group needs our help! Due to the construction project at Union Station, the Platte Valley & Western is being forced to move out. The project is big and we're looking to see if any of your members would be available on the below Saturdays to potentially lend a hand in this process.

. We anticipate it will take 3 - 4 weeks to complete the task however we need to ensure we are careful to attempt to save as much as possible.

We only have 3 - 4 weeks to get this all

done.

We will need as many people as we can get. If you have friends/neighbors/etc. that are handy and willing to help, please let us know. Everyone must be over 18 as this is an active construction site. Safety equipment (hard soled boots, hardhats, gloves & eye protection) is required. There will be a waiver that you will sign. Other items (vests, etc.) that you may not own will be provided by MilanderWhite.

Here's the current timeline for the process. Each day will start as early as 7am. Hopefully we can be done by 2p or 3p as the job site closes down around 3p on Saturdays...

April 20th - Finalize the project plan & determine who is working which Saturdays.

April 27th - Front Yard & Mountain Sub - remove tortoise switch motors, turnouts & electronics. Also attempt to save the packing plant & stock yard complex in one piece. Also remove the items under the layout & any other switches/motors/electronics elsewhere on the layout.

May 4th -Granite/Gunlock Sub - Attempt to save Gunlock area, Granite area & the NG trestle.

May 11th - Arapahoe/Helix/FlatIrons - Attempt to save these areas.
